I. Listening Comprehension

- e) Has great difficulty in making himself/herself understood.

III. Written Language

- a) Has no difficulty in writing on complex topics of any kind without mayor errors using appropriate stylistic register.
- b) Writes fluently on general and academic topics, but makes occasional mistakes concerning grammar, vocabulary and idioms.
- c) Writes on general and academic topics using a limited range of vocabulary and simple structures, makes single mistakes.
- d) Can write on simple issues only with a very limited vocabulary and with numerous syntax errors.
- e) Has great difficulty in expressing thoughts in writing.

IV. Reading Comprehension
